

What to Look For When Taking Scarf Pictures/Scans

This is a quick guide on how to scan/photograph scarves for submitting to the website or for identification. Besides keeping the image style consistent, it also offers guidelines on how to make sure some important features that can date or identify a scarf are included in the scan. Please scan at at least 300 dpi or photograph at the highest resolution possible.



A scarf with four different sides

Please take two pictures/scans; one of each side.



A scarf with two different sides

Take one picture/scan showing both sides.

Try to take the manufacturers' "logo" and "label" if available. The logos move appear in different places depending on when the scarf was made and the label can date a scarf.

A scarf that looks the same on both sides

Take one picture of two sides and try to take manufacturers' "logo" and "label" if available.

Opposite are two scarves that look the same but are slightly different and are from different manufacturing runs. Some units have the same colors and the location of the logo is the only way to tell them apart.
